## **Woodworking Information Available on the Internet**

### **Wood, Sawdust, and iTunes?**

Most everyone that gets online now is familiar with YouTube and iTunes. Did you know that you can get video podcasts through iTunes also? You may say, "But I don't have an iPod, especially one that plays videos." iTunes, <http://www.apple.com/itunes/>, is a free program that lets you subscribe to audio and video podcasts and play them on your computer without the need for a separate player. You really do need broadband internet service to make it work well since dialup connections are too slow. There is an amazing number of free broadcasts available on almost any subject and some very good ones on woodworking. It is easy to subscribe to them for free through the iTunes store and get any new episodes automatically. Here are some of the ones I've found:

*Video podcasts -*

**"Woodworking Online"** This one is almost an hour long and there are 15 episodes available. Show description: "All the same great tips and techniques that you get from Woodsmith magazine ...and much more! This video podcast is taped weekly at the Woodsmith Store in Des Moines, Iowa and is brought to you by the editors and staff of Woodsmith magazine."

**"The Wood Whisperer"** A very good podcast with about 25 episodes of ten to fifteen minutes each.

Show description: "This podcast offers a refreshing look at an age-old craft. Marc delivers solid woodworking advice with a sense of humor. The show is funny, unapologetic, and smart. Its woodworking with a twist!! ---Visit our website at [TheWoodWhisperer.com](http://TheWoodWhisperer.com)"

**"Furnitology"** There are five episodes so far and it concentrates on furniture building.

*Audio podcasts - (Text files are sometimes sent too.)*

**"Matt's Basement Workshop"** Over ninety short podcasts of about ten minutes each.

Show description: "An amateur woodworker talking shop and sharing his experiences with all of you. If you're new to woodworking or just enjoy time in the shop check out the show. Straight grains and sharp blades."

There are a couple more that have not had new episodes for a few months but you can still try them out:

**"Alesi's Woodworking - Designs in Tradition"**

**"Toolmonger - The Week in Tools"**

If you like the podcasts you find then you probably should let them know so they will continue the hard work in putting them out.
