Hartville Tool

The Midwest Woodworkers' Association has been approved for participation in the Hartville Tool Woodworking Club Discount Program. Club members have been entered into their system and may now begin to take advantage of the program.

Club members receive a 20% discount on regularly priced items (some exclusions) in the first year of the club's participation. Beginning the second year the discount goes to 15% and member purchases made in the second year and each succeeding year thereafter, will count toward the annual 3% Club Rebate. This rebate can be used by the club for the purchase of items to benefit club activities.

Discount Program buying Instructions

Ordering Online

If your e-mail address submitted to Hartville Tool by the club, you will automatically receive an e-mail notification welcoming you to the program as soon as you are enrolled. Once you get the e-mail you should go to their website (www.hartvilletool.com) and log in under "My Account". The site should recognize your e-mail address automatically and pop it in the top line. Unless you were a prior customer who had previously set up an account, you will not have a password and should click on "Forgot Password" just below. Within a few minutes their system will send out a temporary password. You should use that to get in, and then you may edit it to whatever you wish.

You must log in to see and receive the discount when ordering online. The discount is shown once an item is dropped onto the Shopping Cart. If an item is on sale or clearance, you will be given which ever is the better deal - either the sale price or the discount (but not both).

If you are not initially set-up for web ordering, but later decide you would like to order online, please call Hartville Tool at 800-345-2396 with your e-mail address. Once they add your e-mail address to your customer file an e-mail will be automatically sent notifying you that your online account has been activated, and you can begin ordering as outlined above.

NOTE: Members sometimes do not get notifications due to several reasons, including 1) E-Mail address changes since Hartville received the list; 2) Incorrect e-mail supplied; 3) Mis-typing at entry; 4) Spam blocks. Members who suspect a problem in this regard should give Hartville a call so the problem can be corrected.

Ordering by Phone, Fax or Mail

To help ensure that you receive the special discounted club pricing when ordering by phone, fax, or mail, you should be sure to mention that you are a Club Discount Program participant.
