
President's Letter Norm Anderson

Plans for car bodies are on the club's website or make up your own. Anything looks like a car if you put wheels on it. Holes for axel pegs should be drilled with a 15/64" or wire size #1 bit. We get together to paint the car bodies at the PET shop on the Thursday evening (6:30 PM) following the monthly MWA meeting and all are welcome to help. If you don't have a bandsaw, the club has 2x4's and 2x6's cut at a molding shop and car bodies can be easily cut 2" wide with a table saw or a miter saw. Car stock is available from Terry at the Boone County Mill Shop. Please consider picking up a couple of pieces at the February meeting and cutting, drilling, sanding, and rounding over the edges of some car bodies. We can use some more help raising funds for the club's activities and making Christmas better for children in our community.
