## President's Letter

Greetings Woodworkers,

<u>Our March Meeting</u> -- Our March meeting was held at Boone County Millworks. I was very sorry to have to miss it. Duane Perry gave a presentation on making a bench (a park bench style) that converts to half a picnic table by allowing the back to rotate and lock horizontally to make a table top. Duane brought pieces that represent various stages of construction, and also brought a completed bench.

Duane noted that he got the basic plan for the bench as a free plan from the <u>www.anawhite.com</u> website, and he then modified those plans. In addition to demonstrating and discussing his processes for making the bench, he also discussed wood selection, as well as finishes for outdoor furniture. As could be seen from the picture that we posted last month, these are gorgeous benches. I am told that it was an excellent presentation. We really appreciate Duane taking the time to put all of this together, bring all of his stuff, and enlighten us with his presentation. Duane, thank you very much.
