CUTTING BOARD CLASS

This class is taught by Tom Hutchinson and will be held at his home shop, at 15361 Hopper Rd, Sturgeon MO 65284. The shop is supplied with the latest machinery, a 19" Grizzly band saw, 12" planer, 6" jointer, 2 spindle sanders, a 16/32 Performax drum sander and a 24" Grizzly duel drum sander. The shop is equipped with a 3 HP Grizzly Cyclone Dust Collector and collection piping goes to each machine. The class takes two afternoons. Enrollment is limited to a maximum of four and a minimum of three students. Tuition is \$50.00 per student. All materials are supplied. There are almost two dozen species of wood to choose from and these will be supplied in either 3/4" or 1" stock.

Question: Does anyone think Titebond 3 is better than Titebond 2. I am near the end of my first gallon of Titebond 3 and am considering going back to 2. I thought I would like the extra water resistance, but when I use 3 I get a darker glue line and I am just not sure it is better, Does anyone have input or read anything one way or the other?

Answer: We had several comments that Titebond 3 is their glue of choice. Another consideration for those of us with poorly heated shops is the minimum temperature recommended for each type of glue. Titebond 3 is labeled for use down to 45°F while others are labeled for use only to 55°F.

Questions:

1. Are there any suggestions for re-chucking/centering a piece that has come off?
2. Any suggestions for how to center up segmented rings for gluing?
