September 2018 MWA Meeting

The September 2018 meeting of the MWA will be held at my shop located at 4089 North Thompson Road (map below) on Monday September 24, 2018. Unfortunately, most GPS units will not recognize this address and will take you to the wrong place. Directions are as follows:

Take US Highway 63 north, take the Vandiver exit

Go ³/₄ of the way around the roundabout to the access road, take the access road north to the roundabout at Mexico Gravel Road

Go ¼ of the way around the roundabout and continue on Mexico Gravel Road to the next roundabout (intersection of Mexico Gravel Road and Ballenger/Route PP)

Go 1/2 of the way around the roundabout and continue on Mexico Gravel Road/Route PP

Turn left (north) on Wyatt Lane (second left off of Mexico Gravel/Route PP)

Go north on Wyatt Lane for 1/4 mile

Turn right (east) on Thompson Road

Go east on Thompson Road for ¹/₂ mile (Thompson Road then angles to the north)

Turn left (west) on E.P. Moore (private gravel road; there is a green house number sign on the stop sign post)

4089 North Thompson Road is on the left (hidden by a hedge, not easily visible from the intersection of Thompson Road and E.P. Moore)

Large yellow pole barn surrounded by a chain link fence


Call 573-355-8235 if you get lost

The program will be about box (finger) joints. If you have a box joint jig that you like to use, please bring it along and we can discuss the advantages and disadvantages of the various kinds. I have about a dozen chairs so it please bring a lawn chair if you can. I will run the router briefly and will have foam ear plugs but feel free to bring ear muffs if you find those more comfortable.

The meeting will start at 6:30 PM but I plan to put on a pot of ham and beans if you are able to come between 5:30 and 6:30.

Summary: bring your favorite box joint jig, bring a lawn chair and ear protection, come at 5:30 for ham and beans. Call my cell phone if you get lost.
