MWA Christmas Toy Project

Ernest and Rich presented a toy project demonstration at a gallery in Kirksville before Christmas and the gallery owner generously donated a trove of wooden wheels and other toy parts that had belonged to her late husband. I have sorted and inventoried the parts and will bring several copies of the spreadsheet to the January meeting. If any MWA members can use any of the parts, I will make arrangements to get them to you. In addition, there were some nails and screws of various sizes which I will bring to the meeting for anyone who can use them.

The toy boxes are empty and it's time to start making car bodies for the 2020 Christmas season, We usually need 1800 to 2000 cars to meet our needs for the Pumpkin Festival and Christmas distribution. Terry has molded car stock available at the mill shop or there are some suggested shapes for bandsawn car bodies on the club website. Just be sure to drill the axle holes with a $15/64^{\text{th}}$ or $7/32^{\text{nd}}$ bit and be sure to drill the holes close enough to the bottom of the car so the wheels touch the ground.
