### **TOY CAR ASSEMBLY**

After the Pumpkin Festival, we will need to put wheels on the toy cars that remain and get them ready for distribution to various children’s service agencies prior to Christmas. ### **TOY DISTRIBUTION**

Yet another opportunity to volunteer for the Christmas Toy Project will be in early December when help is needed to deliver toys to various places around Columbia and Boone County. I will send a note when I have the cars ready for delivery and you can pick them up at my shop.

### **CAR BODY STOCK**

Terry tells me he has a new supply of car body stock ready to go for the 2024 car building season. These are molded 2 x 4’s and 2 x 6’s that have been molded into the shape of a car. They need to be cut into 2 inch sections, holes drilled for axle pegs, sanded, and the edges routed. More detailed instructions are available if you need them. ### **PLANNING WAY AHEAD**

In the spring and summer of 2024, we will need to paint the car bodies that have been made. Experience has shown that it is easiest to spray the cars on a sheet of cardboard that is placed on a piece of plywood. The plywood pieces are 24” x 24”. My supply of cardboard sheets has been exhausted so we could use some more that are approximately 24 x 24 (more or less).
